We work with clients who have suffered catastrophic injuries and are involved in litigation claims against third parties. We also work on behalf of a local authority adaptations team, with clients of all ages who have chronic medical conditions.

This role will involve supporting the team to provide major and minor adaptations and specialist equipment to people's homes, to improve independence and safety. Knowledge of specialist equipment, adaptations and manual handling is required in order to recommend suitable solutions for clients.

Job Overview

Your role will involve undertaking occupational therapist assessments of the housing needs of adults and children with disabilities. You will be asked to come up with suitable solutions to your clients' challenging problems. In this role you will have the ability to improve people's lives by recommending adaptations to overcome environmental barriers.

This role will suit you if you have 2-3 years of occupational therapist experience specialising in housing and manual handling.
